RE: **A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE VILLAGE MANAGER TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT FOR THE PURCHASE OF ELECTRICITY THROUGH THE NORTHERN ILLINOIS MUNICIPAL ELECTRIC COOPERATIVE (NIMEC)**

BACKGROUND/DISCUSSION:

On January 6, 2020, Mr. David Hoover, the Executive Director of NIMEC (Northern Illinois Municipal Electric Collaborative), will make a presentation to the Board of Trustees on an opportunity for the Village to obtain 100 percent Renewable Energy Credits (RECs) for ComEd residential and small business electric customers. NIMEC assists member municipalities to negotiate lower electric rates for residents and small businesses.

In March 2012, Park Forest residents voted to allow the Village to contract for an electric generation supplier on their behalf. This program, known as municipal aggregation, allows local officials to aggregate residential accounts to gain group buying power for the purchase of competitively priced electricity from an alternative retail electric supplier certified by the Illinois Commerce Commission. From mid-2012 through mid-2014, most Park Forest residents were served with electric power sourced by FirstEnergy Solutions, and saved a total of over \$2 million because the power was purchased at a lower rate than that offered by ComEd's default rate. As part of that municipal aggregation program, 50 percent of the energy purchased was sourced from renewable energy.

Since late 2014, ComEd's default rate for electric power has declined enough that it is no longer financially feasible to aggregate power for the purpose of saving residents money on their electric bills. However, it is possible to aggregate power for the purpose of sourcing the Village's power from 100 percent renewable energy, while keeping residents' electric rate unchanged. The attached material from NIMEC explains how this works, and Mr. Hoover will provide a more in-depth explanation.

In February 2019, the Village Board adopted the *Climate Action and Resilience Plan* (CARP) as an element of the Village's comprehensive plan. The CARP establishes a target to reduce community-wide greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions by 26 percent below 2010 levels by 2025. This is the same goal as that adopted by the Paris Climate Agreement. From 2010 to 2015, GHG emissions were reduced by 3.8 percent based on energy efficiency measures adopted by the Village, residents, and businesses. If 100 percent of Park Forest households were included in this proposed municipal aggregation program, it would have the following benefits from a climate action perspective:

- Over 27,000 metric tons of greenhouse gases per year would be eliminated, theoretically preventing \$6 million in future damage globally due to climate change.
- In order to get the same GHG savings, the Village would have to plant 30,000 trees – and let them grow for 40 years.
- A 14.1 percent reduction in overall emissions from the 2010 baseline.

Should Village Officials decide to move forward with the renewable energy aggregation concept, following are some items to consider/understand:

- The contract with the renewable energy supplier would last anywhere from 1 to 3 years.
- Residents would likely not save any money on their monthly electric bill. However, **there would be no additional costs to Park Foresters** and the initiative would be a community-wide undertaking aimed at drastically reducing Park Forest's adverse impacts on the environment.
- The transition to the renewable energy supplier would be seamless for residents. They would still get their monthly bill from ComEd as this company would continue to be the company delivering their power supply.
- Per state law regulating electric aggregation, official letters would be sent to all impacted residents educating them on what is being undertaken. Additionally, residents would be provided the ability to “opt-out” of the aggregation project should they decide to stay with ComEd's current energy supplier.
- It is quite likely that the marketplace for renewable energy suppliers may render an annual contribution back to Park Forest in each year of the contract. It is estimated that this contribution could be anywhere from \$25,000 - \$50,000. It is plausible that these contributions could help fund the implementation of additional sustainability projects as laid out in the *Park Forest Sustainability Plan* and the CARP.

Upon discussion of this concept at the January 6th Village Board Meeting, the attached resolution was developed collaboratively by Village Staff and legal counsel.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE VILLAGE MANAGER TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT FOR THE PURCHASE OF ELECTRICITY THROUGH THE NORTHERN ILLINOIS MUNICIPAL ELECTRIC COOPERATIVE (NIMEC)

WHEREAS, the Village of Park Forest (“Village”) is a home rule municipality within the purview of Article VII Section 6(a) of the Illinois Constitution, and as such may exercise any power or perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs (the “Home Rule Powers”); and

WHEREAS, in March of 2012, Village residents voted by referendum to approve an opt-out energy aggregation program for electricity services in order allow the Village to contract for an electric generation supplier on their behalf; and

WHEREAS, Northern Illinois Municipal Electric Cooperative (“NIMEC”), an electric purchasing co-operative which allows officials to aggregate residential accounts to gain buying power for the purpose of procuring electricity through a cooperative pool in order to receive a more competitive price on electricity; and

WHEREAS, NIMEC intends to conduct a formal bidding procedure on behalf of the Village for the provision of electricity for the Village; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the rules and regulations governing the NIMEC bid procedure, the Village may decide whether to enter into a contract for the provision of electricity; and

WHEREAS, a contract with a renewable energy source provider will last no more than three (3) years with no additional costs to the residents of Park Forest; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Board of Trustees believe it is in the best interests of the Village and its residents to provide the Village Manager with the authority to perform all obligations and commitments of the Village in accordance with the provisions of the contract.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Board of Trustees of the Village of Park Forest, Cook and Will Counties, Illinois, in the exercise of Park Forest’s home rule powers as follows:

Section 1: The foregoing preambles are restated and incorporated herein by reference as though fully set forth herein.

Section 2: The Mayor and Board of Trustees shall, and do hereby, authorize the Village Manager to review and execute, on behalf of the Village, an agreement for a term not to exceed three (3) years for the provision of electricity for the Village with the entity that submits the lowest qualified bid to NIMEC therefore, and necessary documentation thereto.

This Resolution shall not be deemed or interpreted as obligating the Village Manager to execute any contract with any entity that submits a bid to NIMEC. In the event that the Village Manager determines, in his discretion, that the bids submitted to NIMEC for the provision of electricity for the Village are not favorable to the Village, then the Village Manager shall be, and is hereby, authorized to reject all of the bids on behalf of the Village.

Section 3: If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this resolution shall be held invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect any of the other provisions of this resolution.

Section 4: All resolutions in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 5: This resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.



100% Green Community Aggregation

Proposal:

To implement a Municipal Electric Aggregation program with 100% Renewable Energy Credits (RECs) for residents and small businesses *at no additional cost*. Residents and small businesses would be billed at the ComEd residential rate. In comparison, ComEd supply service provides only 14.5% RECs.

History:

Municipal electric aggregation has achieved great success and favorability across Illinois since 2011, saving cumulative hundreds of millions of dollars for residents in communities that have implemented the programs. Many communities are undertaking steps to reduce their collective carbon footprint by enacting community-wide sustainable practices and policies. 95 Chicago metropolitan municipalities have adopted the Greenest Region Compact.

How it Works:

- Every electric account establishes unique usage consumption patterns. Factors such as volume, time of day, single family vs. multi-family, and usage during ComEd peak periods combine to create a complex power usage profile.
- The cost of producing electricity is highly variable. Generators are required, by law, to ensure it is perpetually available in full, and on demand.
- Therefore, suppliers analyze that variable cost to serve each account and price each account's individual rate.

When suppliers analyze a community for a 100% Green Community Aggregation program, they calculate the price for each individual account and will switch only those accounts for which power costs less than the ComEd default rate. The remainder of the accounts that are costlier to serve will remain on ComEd supply service. However, the entire aggregation, including those remaining on ComEd supply, receive 100% RECs for all power consumed.

All residents would continue to be billed by ComEd. All residents would pay the same ComEd default rate.

The profitable margin on the favorable (lower cost) accounts enables the supplier to purchase RECs for the entire Community Aggregation—including all ratepayers who remain with ComEd. All residents receive notice of the program, with the explanation that 100% of their power consumption is offset by RECs. The RECs are derived from wind energy in the Midwest, thus supporting local renewable power generators.

Ratepayers may opt out or leave with no early termination fee at any time for any reason. Ratepayers who have already chosen their own individual supplier contract are not included in the program.

This program, 100% Green Community Aggregation, enables the Village to receive the designation of US EPA Green Power Community.

RE: Intergovernmental Agreement with the Regional Transportation Authority (RTA) for Rte. 30 Sidewalk (Orchard Drive to East Village Limits)

BACKGROUND/DISCUSSION

In 2016, the Village improved the Rte. 30 corridor with landscaping and fencing. Additionally, a five foot wide sidewalk was installed from Orchard Drive to the 211th St Metra Station. Sidewalk was not installed east of Orchard due to a lack of funding, though construction provided a gap so that it could be easily constructed at a later date. In 2018, the Village applied to the Regional Transportation Authority’s (RTA) “Access to Transit Program” to complete the sidewalk to the east Village limits. In order to provide a strong application, DPW recommended that the Village provide Phase 1 engineering to prove the viability of the project. In the spring of 2019, Phase 1 Engineering was approved by the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) and our funding application was awarded shortly thereafter.

RTA’s “Access to Transit Program” combined several regional transportation projects and applied to the Chicago Metropolitan Agency for Planning (CMAP) for Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality (CMAQ) funding. Thus, the grant will be paid 80% from CMAQ funds. The RTA has agreed to reimburse to the Village the remaining 20%, capped at \$46,560. Below is a table that outlines the funding breakdown, along with the federal fiscal year the funds are scheduled to be allocated.

**Phase 1 Engineering was funded and completed by the Village in 2019 for a cost of \$30,725. This is an additional project cost and it will not be reimbursed to the Village.*

The attached Exhibit A is an Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) with Regional Transportation Authority in order to reimburse the Village 20% of the project cost, capped at \$46,560. After agreeing to this IGA, DPW's next step to be to solicit engineering qualifications to perform Phase 2 engineering. It is anticipated that an engineering agreement will be presented to the Board is early 2020.

RECOMMENDATION: Approve the Enabling Resolution and approve the Mayor to sign an Intergovernmental Agreement with Regional Transportation Authority (RTA) pertaining to the 2020-2024 Park Forest Access to Transit Agreement.

INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT

This Intergovernmental Agreement (the "Agreement") is entered into by and between the Regional Transportation Authority (the "RTA"), a municipal corporation created under the laws of the State of Illinois, and the Village of Park Forest, Illinois (the "Village"), a municipal corporation created under the laws of the State of Illinois (the RTA and the Village of Park Forest are each referred to herein individually as a "Party" and collectively as the "Parties").

Pursuant to Article VII, §10 of the Illinois Constitution of 1970 and the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act, as amended, (5 ILCS 220/1 *et seq.*), the RTA and the Village enter into this Agreement.

Section 1. NATURE AND PURPOSE OF AGREEMENT

The Parties to this Agreement desire to ensure completion of this Project, which will install a five foot wide sidewalk along the south side of US30 / Lincoln Highway in the Village of Park Forest from Orchard Drive east to the Village limits at Rockwell Street, and then south along an undeveloped right-of-way to connect to an existing sidewalk in a residential neighborhood on Farragut Street. This is a segment of 2,425 linear feet and is the final segment of a greater project to build needed sidewalk connections along US30 from the eastern Village limits to the 211th Street Metra station.

The RTA and the Village each has the statutory authority to sponsor or participate in the Project and to enter into this Agreement. It is the purpose of this Agreement to set forth the respective understandings, covenants and obligations of the Parties with respect to the Project.

Section 2. FUNDING THE PROJECT

a. The RTA has secured Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality Improvement (CMAQ) grant funding from the U.S. Department of Transportation in order to complete the Project. A local match is required as a condition of the grant.

b. The RTA will provide an amount not to exceed \$46,560.00, which represents 20% of the total Project.

c. The Village is responsible for 100% of an overage should the total project costs exceed \$232,802.00 as a result of a project amendment.

Section 3. PAYMENT CONDITIONS AND PROCEDURES

a. Allowable costs shall be necessary in order to accomplish the Project.

b. Allowable costs shall be reasonable in amount for the goods or services purchased.

c. Allowable costs shall be actual net costs to the Village (i.e., the price paid minus any refunds, rebates, or other items of value received by the Village which have the effect of reducing the cost actually incurred).

d. Allowable costs shall be incurred (and for work performed) after the effective date of this Agreement, unless specific authorization from the RTA to the contrary is received (in no event will the RTA provide funding to reimburse expenses incurred after expiration of this Agreement).

e. To the extent applicable, allowable costs shall be in conformance with the standards for allowability of costs established by the Illinois Department of Transportation ("IDOT"). State of Illinois rates apply for travel, lodging, meals and other expenses, as applicable.

f. Allowable costs shall be satisfactorily documented.

g. Allowable costs shall be treated uniformly and consistently under accounting principles and procedures approved or prescribed by generally accepted accounting principles, and those approved or prescribed by the Village for its contractors.

h. Allowable costs shall be supported by properly executed payrolls, time records, invoices, contracts, or vouchers evidencing in detail the nature and propriety of the charges. If it may be impractical to determine exact costs of indirect or service functions, allowable costs will include such allowances for these costs as may be approved by the RTA.

i. In order to receive payments, the Village shall execute and timely submit to the RTA a requisition for approval by the RTA.

j. Upon receipt of the completed requisition form and the accompanying information in satisfactory form, the RTA shall process the requisition. If the Village is complying with its obligations pursuant to the Agreement, the RTA shall reimburse

apparent allowable costs incurred by the Village up to the maximum amount of the RTA Agreement. However, reimbursement of any cost pursuant to this paragraph shall not constitute a final determination by the RTA of the allowability of such cost and shall not constitute a waiver of any violation of the terms of this Agreement committed by the Village.

Section 4. GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

a. Amendment.

The Parties agree that no change or modification of this Agreement shall be of any force or effect unless such amendment is dated, reduced to writing, executed by all Parties, and attached to and made a part of this Agreement. Any amendment to the scope of work or project location must be submitted in writing to the RTA and accepted by the RTA prior to seeking an amendment by the CMAQ Selection Committee.

b. Indemnification.

The Village will indemnify, defend and hold harmless the RTA, its officials, agents and employees against any and all liabilities, losses, damages, claims, injuries, deaths, suits, costs, payments and expenses of every kind and nature, including reasonable attorneys' fees and disbursements, as a result of claims, demands, actions, suits, proceedings, judgments or settlements, that result from or arise out of any acts or omissions to act by the Village, its corporate authorities, employees, agents and assigns in the performance of this Agreement. The Village will appear and defend all suits brought upon all such claims, demands, actions and proceedings and shall pay all costs and expenses incidental thereto, but the RTA will have the right, at its sole option and expense, to participate in the defense of any suit, without relieving the Village of any of its obligations hereunder. The indemnification obligation contained in this paragraph will survive termination or expiration of this Agreement.

c. Confidentiality.

Any documents, data, records or other information given to or prepared by the Parties pursuant to this Agreement shall be maintained in a confidential manner and shall not be made available to any individual or organization (other than the RTA or the Village) without prior written approval by the RTA, except to the extent required by law.

d. Documents Forming this Agreement.

The Parties agree that this constitutes the entire Agreement between the Parties hereto, that there are no agreements or understandings, implied or expressed, except as specifically set forth in this Agreement.

e. Warranties and Representations.

In connection with the execution of this Agreement, the Village and the RTA each warrant and represent that it is legally authorized to execute and perform or cause to be performed this Agreement under the terms and conditions stated herein.

f. Non-liability of Public Officials.

No official, employee or agent of the RTA or the Village will be charged personally by the other party with any liability or expense of defense or be held personally liable under any term or provision of this Agreement or because of the Village's or the RTA's execution or attempted execution or because of any breach hereof.

g. Counterparts.

This Agreement may be comprised of several identical counterparts, each of which may be fully executed by the parties hereto and, once executed, will be deemed an original having identical legal effect.

h. Severability.

If any provisions of this Agreement will be held or deemed to be or will in fact be inoperative or unenforceable as applied in any particular case in any jurisdiction or in all cases because it conflicts with any other provision or provisions hereof or of any constitution, statute, ordinance, rule of law or public policy, or for any other reason, such circumstances will not have the effect of rendering any other provision or provisions herein contained invalid, inoperative, or unenforceable to any extent whatsoever. The invalidity of any one or more phrases, sentences, clauses or sections contained in this Agreement will not affect the remaining portions of this Agreement or any part thereof.

i. Interpretation.

Any headings of this Agreement are for convenience of reference only and do not define or limit the provisions thereof. Words of any gender will be deemed and construed to include correlative words of the other gender. Words importing the singular number will include the plural number and vice versa, unless the context will otherwise indicate. All references to any exhibit or document will be deemed to include all supplements and/or amendments to any such exhibits or documents entered into in accordance with the terms and conditions thereof. All references to any person or entity will be deemed to include any person or entity succeeding to the rights, duties and obligations of such persons or entities in accordance with the terms and conditions of this Agreement.

j. Cooperation.

The Village and the RTA agree at all times to cooperate fully with one another in the implementation of this Agreement.

k. Assignment.

Neither the RTA nor the Village will assign, delegate or otherwise transfer all or any part of their rights or obligations under this Agreement, or any part hereof, unless as approved in writing by the other party. The absence of written consent will void the attempted assignment, delegation or transfer and will render it of no effect.

l. Force Majeure.

Neither the RTA nor the Village will be obligated to perform any of their obligations hereunder if prevented from doing so by reasons outside of their reasonable control, including, but not limited to, events of force majeure.

m. Governing Law.

The Parties agree that, notwithstanding conflict of law principles, disputes which arise as a result of this Agreement will be heard in an Illinois court of competent jurisdiction and that Illinois law will be applied.

n. Third Parties.

Nothing in this Agreement is intended to create rights in any parties other than the RTA and the Village.

o. Appropriation.

If the term of this Agreement extends beyond the current fiscal year of the RTA (the current fiscal year being the year in which the first date of the term of this Agreement falls), this Agreement is subject to the appropriation of funds by the RTA's Board of Directors for each subsequent year. If the RTA fails to make such an appropriation, the RTA may terminate this Agreement with no further funds due and owing the Village.

p. Audit and Document Retention.

Each party, to the extent applicable, shall maintain for a minimum of three years after completion of this Agreement, adequate books, records and supporting documents related to the Agreement and any associated expenditures; the Agreement shall be available for review and audit by each party, their internal or external auditors and/or the Auditor General of the State of Illinois; and each party shall cooperate fully with any audit and provide full access to all relevant materials.

q. Notices.

All notices, other communications and approvals required or permitted by this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be delivered, sent by certified or registered mail (return receipt requested and postage prepaid) addressed as follows:

or to such other persons or addresses as either party may from time to time designate by notice to the other. All notices required hereunder shall be in writing and shall be deemed properly served if delivered in person or if sent by registered or certified mail, with postage prepaid and return receipt requested, to the addresses specified. All notices sent via electronic mail shall be deemed received as of the date an acknowledgment of receipt, via electronic mail reply, is sent by the original recipient to the original sender. All hard copy notices required hereunder shall be deemed received on the date of delivery, or attempted delivery, if delivered in person, or if mailed, on the date which is two (2) days after the date such notice is deposited in the mail.

Section 5. TERM/TERMINATION

a. Term.

This Agreement will commence as of the date of final execution by both parties and will continue until December 31, 2024. This Agreement may be extended at the sole discretion of the RTA, by advance written notice to the Village.

b. Termination.

This Agreement may be terminated by either the RTA or the Village upon ninety (90) days written notice sent to the other party in accordance with this Section 4 herein.

BACKGROUND/DISCUSSION:

Village vehicle and equipment replacement is budgeted annually and begins first in the 5 Year Capital Plan. Replacement of the Village's 1994 International 6 wheeler is designated for replacement this fiscal year. The vehicle will be purchased per the State of Illinois Contract #19-416 CMS-Boss 4-B-2573 that was awarded to Rush Truck Centers of Illinois for the 2019-2020 purchasing year.

This Agenda item consists of the purchase of a 2021 International HV607 through the State of Illinois Joint Purchasing Contract awarded to Rush Truck Centers of Illinois at the cost of \$94,834 dollars, with a dump body to be fabricated by Lindco Equipment Sales, Inc at the cost of \$41,566 dollars, including warranties, freight, license, title, and taxes for a total purchase price of \$136,722 dollars. Attached are the Sale Proposal/Quotation, Specifications, and Warranties. There is no trade in value for the old unit, therefore the old unit will be auctioned at a future date.

The vehicle/equipment to be replaced is a 1994 International 6 Wheel Dump Truck which is used by DPW staff for hauling large amounts of asphalt, dirt, concrete, and stone for disposal and various water main, sewer, and street repairs. This new truck will be used for the same tasks as outlined above and DPW is planning ahead to also use this truck during the winter season to apply anti-icing materials to village roadways in an effort to reduce salt usage, reduce the Village's chloride run off into storm sewers and local waterways, to support the south suburbs effort to reduce chloride levels in the Chicago Waterways, and transition into the methods of anti-icing instead of deicing. DPW plans to purchase a liquid tank with a spray bar that will slide into the bed of this truck at a future date. This equipment will be purchased through the Vehicle Services Fund – Capital Outlays where \$155,000 has been budgeted for this equipment purchase.


RECOMMENDATION: Authorize the Village Manager to approve a Purchase Order in the amount of \$136,722 dollars for this purchase.





BACKGROUND/DISCUSSION:

SouthCom is currently making improvements to communication equipment which serve member agencies. Neighboring municipalities are currently making improvements to their communication infrastructure and Park Forest is tasked to do the same. To date, Public Works and Miner Electronics have removed old equipment and installed radio dishes and other needed equipment onto Autumn Ridge Water Tower and Blackhawk Water Tower. The last communication point for the Village's infrastructure is the Police Department communication tower. The existing self-supporting lattice tower was analyzed by a structural engineer from an engineering firm. This tower has been in place for several decades and the existing foundation was found to be inadequate to support existing equipment and the new SouthCom communication equipment. Therefore, the communication tower and foundation need to be replaced.

Miner Electronics has provided the following agreement/proposal for a new tower foundation, the manufacturing, delivery, and erection of a new self-supporting lattice tower, the installation/mounting, connection, and testing of South Com radio dishes, and final set up of communication links of all three sites. The agreement price for this work is \$112,513.40

This project is not included in the current budget but there are sufficient Fund Balance Reserves that will be used to complete this project.

RECOMMENDATION: Authorize the Village Manager to enter into this Agreement and issue a Purchase Order in the amount of \$112,513.40 along with a 10% contingency of \$11,251.34, for any unforeseen/additional work as determined by the Village Engineer, for a total not to exceed cost of \$123,764.74.

COMMUNICATIONS SYSTEM AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into this ____ day of _____, 2019 by and between Miner Electronics Corporation herein referred to as “Seller”, and **Village of Park Forest**, hereinafter referred to as “Purchaser”.

WHEREAS the purchaser desires to purchase Radio Communication Equipment and Services as described below:

- **100 Foot self-supporting tower**
- **New VHF antenna system**

Scope of Work

1. Miner Electronics will furnish all of the services as outlined in addendums A, equipment & B, services and project management: such tools, supplies, labor, training, and supervision necessary for the implementation for those items purchased to be provided as detailed.

2. Purchaser shall in addition to responsibilities described in the Scope of Work included in addendum B of this agreement, perform the following coincident with the performance of this agreement:

- a. Provide a designated Project Director
- b. Provide access to facilities in order to implement installations and services
- c. Provide designated work area with adequate heat and light, and secure storage area for equipment delivered to the purchaser
- d. Provide adequate AC power at 117 VAC +/- 60 Hz for the installation and operation of equipment
- e. Adequate facilities in order to conduct professional training if necessary

SITES

This agreement is predicated on the utilization of sites and site configurations, which have been selected either by the purchaser or Miner Electronics as contained in the Miner Electronics proposal. In either situation, should it be determined by either Miner Electronics or the purchaser during the course of performance on this agreement that the site or sites are no longer available or desired, new or replacement sites or configuration will be selected and approved by both Miner and Purchaser. If any price adjustments are necessary as a result of

those new sites, such price adjustments will be added to this agreement by a change order in accordance to the General Conditions of this agreement.

PERIOD OF PERFORMANCE

1. Miner Electronics shall complete the work in accordance with the following schedule:

See Addendum C: Schedule of Work

2. Whenever Miner knows or reasonably should know that any actual or potential Condition due to circumstances beyond its control is delaying or threatens to delay the timely performance of work, Miner shall give Purchaser notice thereof and may request an extension of time to perform the work.

ACCEPTANCE CRITERIA

- 1) An acceptance test plan which has been agreed to by both parties either in writing or prior to this agreement or by execution of this agreement and is included as Addendum D to this agreement. The successful completion of the ATP will be the sole criteria for system acceptance.
- 2) Should the purchaser commence use of the system or any subsystem thereof for their intended purposes, other than for the express purpose of training or testing, prior to system acceptance, partial payment for said system shall be due net thirty (30) days. The warranty or maintenance periods for such equipment put into use, shall not be deemed to have commenced concurrently with the use of the equipment for its intended purposes until the ATP has been prepared and been accepted. The use of the equipment for its intended purposes shall be deemed to have occurred when the Purchaser commences to use and rely primarily on the equipment for its communications.
- 3) Upon notification by Miner Electronics that the system is ready for Acceptance Testing, it is agreed that should the acceptance testing of the system be delayed for more than 10 days after notification for reasons not related to Miner Electronics' performance of this agreement, the final payment for the system shall be immediately invoiced and warranty or maintenance shall commence upon notice to Purchaser by Miner Electronics.

PAYMENT SCHEDULE

- 1) Miner Electronics agrees to sell all of the equipment and perform the services as outlined in the Scope of Work section in addendums A & B, and the Purchaser agrees to buy the aforementioned equipment and services for the sum of **\$112,513.40**.
- 2) In the event of failure or delay caused by the Purchaser in providing space, sites, approvals, licenses, or any other Purchaser obligations required preceding delivery of equipment, it is agreed that Miner electronics, at its sole discretion, may ship equipment as planned and Purchaser will accept the equipment and make payment in accordance with the terms of this agreement. Any additional costs incurred by Miner for storage of equipment will be invoiced and paid by Purchaser.
- 3) The Purchaser shall make payments to Miner Electronics as follows:

**Miner will Invoice: 40% of total upon Contract Authorization
 (\$45,005.00)
 40% upon delivery of equipment
 (\$45,005.00)
 20% upon execution of Acceptance Certificate
 (\$22,503.40)**

PROJECT MANAGEMENT

- 1) All matters affecting the terms of this agreement or the administration thereof shall be referred to Miner's responsible Contract Administrator who shall have authority to negotiate changes or amendments to this agreement.
- 2) Due to the complexity of the project Miner will assign a Project manager, who is authorized to exercise technical direction of this project.

DISPUTES

Miner and the Purchaser will attempt to settle any claim or controversy arising out of this agreement through consultation and negotiation in good faith and a spirit of mutual cooperation. If those attempts fail, then the dispute will be mediated by a mutually acceptable Mediator to be chosen by Miner and Purchaser within thirty days after written notice by one of the parties demanding non-binding mediation. Neither one of the parties may unreasonably withhold consent to the selection of the Mediator, and Miner and the Purchaser will share the

cost of the mediation equally. By mutual agreement, however, Miner and the Purchaser may postpone mediation until both parties have completed some specified but limited discovery about the dispute. The parties may also agree to replace mediation with some other form of non-binding alternate resolution procedure ADR.

Any dispute that cannot be resolved between the parties through negotiation or mediation within two (2) months from the date of the initial demand for it by one of the parties may then be submitted to a court of competent jurisdiction in Indiana with the venue being Lake County, Indiana. Both miner and Purchaser consent to jurisdiction (over it) by such a court. The use of the ADR procedures will not be considered under the doctrine of laches, waiver, or estoppel to affect adversely the rights of either party. Nothing shall prevent either of the parties from resorting to judicial proceedings mentioned in this paragraph if (a) good faith efforts to attempt resolution of the dispute under these procedures have been unsuccessful or (b) interim relief from the court is necessary to prevent serious irreparable injury to one of the parties.

SEVERABILITY

If any portion of this agreement, item, paragraph, phrase, clause, or word of the document including any of the addendums are/is held to be invalid, such provision or portion shall be considered **SEVERABLE**, and the remainder of this agreement or any provision or portion thereof shall not be affected.

COMPLIANCE

Miner Electronics agrees to comply with all applicable state, federal, and local statutes, ordinances, and requirements of the Purchaser in regards to items associated with Insurance, Performance and Payment Bonds, Certification of Eligibility, Equal Opportunity Employment, Prevailing Wage, or any other Reasonable requirement. Purchaser agrees to inform Miner Electronics of any such requirement prior to execution of this agreement. Miner Electronics will not be held responsible for any requirement not disclosed by Purchaser in writing prior to agreement execution.

BACKGROUND/DISCUSSION:

An OSEC system is used to generate sodium hypochlorite (bleach) which is stored and later injected into the raw water supply at the aerator and the water main that feeds the distribution system. Sodium hypochlorite is a disinfectant used to keep the Village water supply compliant with Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (IEPA) requirements. A minimum of 0.5 mg/l of free chlorine is required to ensure microbiologically clean water for consumers.

When the new water plant was built in 2006-2007, two OSEC units were installed. Unit #1 became inoperable in 2017 and was replaced with a newer model unit. In the beginning of December 2019, Unit #2 became inoperable and will be replaced with a similar newer model unit. The original OSEC units are no longer made by the manufacturer making it difficult and costly to acquire repair parts and supplies which leads to very long lead times for repairs. Currently, the water plant is relying on Unit #1, for the production of sodium hypochlorite and there is no back up OSEC Unit. Due to the importance of this piece of equipment, staff proceeded with this purchase in December 2019 under the Manager's Emergency Purchase Authority. Delivery is expected in mid to late February.

The new OSEC system will include a new 130 lbs/day sodium hypochlorite generator, electrolyzer cell assembly, heat exchanger, painted steel skid frame, cables and a five (5) year warranty for a purchase price of \$41,396 dollars. EVOQUA will also provide delivery and start up assistance. This purchase will be made from the Water Fund - Supply and Purification – Capital Outlays where a balance of approximately \$70,000 in savings from Well Maintenance Well #3 project will be used for this purchase.

RECOMMENDATION: Authorize the Village Manager to issue a Purchase Order to Wallace & Tiernan, an EVOQUA Company, in the amount of \$41,396.00 for the purchase of 1 OSEC system.

Buyer shall be charged the lower of 1 ½% interest per month or the maximum legal rate on all amounts not received by the due date and shall pay all of Seller's reasonable costs (including attorneys' fees) of collecting amounts due but unpaid. All orders are subject to credit approval by Seller. Back charges without Seller's prior written approval shall not be accepted.

3. Delivery. Delivery of the Work shall be in material compliance with the schedule in Seller's Documentation. Unless Seller's Documentation provides otherwise, delivery terms are ExWorks Seller's factory (Incoterms 2010). Title to all Work shall pass upon receipt of payment for the Work under the respective invoice. Unless otherwise agreed to in writing by Seller, shipping dates are approximate only and Seller shall not be liable for any loss or expense (consequential or otherwise) incurred by Buyer or Buyer's customer if Seller fails to meet the specified delivery schedule.

4. Ownership of Materials and Licenses. All devices, designs (including drawings, plans and specifications), estimates, prices, notes, electronic data, software and other documents or information prepared or disclosed by Seller, and all related intellectual property rights, shall remain Seller's property. Seller grants Buyer a non-exclusive, non-transferable license to use any such material solely for Buyer's use of the Work. Buyer shall not disclose any such material to third parties without Seller's prior written consent. Buyer grants Seller a non-exclusive, non-transferable license to use Buyer's name and logo for marketing purposes, including but not limited to, press releases, marketing and promotional materials, and web site content.

5. Changes. Neither party shall implement any changes in the scope of Work described in Seller's Documentation without a mutually agreed upon change order. Any change to the scope of the Work, delivery schedule for the Work, any Force Majeure Event, any law, rule, regulation, order, code, standard or requirement which requires any change hereunder shall entitle Seller to an equitable adjustment in the price and time of performance.

6. Force Majeure Event. Neither Buyer nor Seller shall have any liability for any breach or delay (except for breach of payment obligations) caused by a Force Majeure Event. If a Force Majeure Event exceeds six (6) months in duration, the Seller shall have the right to terminate the Agreement without liability, upon fifteen (15) days written notice to Buyer, and shall be entitled to payment for work performed prior to the date of termination. "Force Majeure Event" shall mean events or circumstances that are beyond the affected party's control and could not reasonably have been easily avoided or overcome by the affected party and are not substantially attributable to the other party. Force Majeure Event may include, but is not limited to, the following circumstances or events: war, act of foreign enemies, terrorism, riot, strike, or lockout by persons other than by Seller or its sub-suppliers, natural catastrophes or (with respect to on-site work), unusual weather conditions.

7. Warranty. Subject to the following sentence, Seller warrants to Buyer that the (i) Work shall materially conform to the description in Seller's Documentation and shall be free from defects in material and workmanship and (ii) the Services shall be performed in a timely and workmanlike manner. Determination of suitability of treated water for any use by Buyer shall be the sole and exclusive responsibility of Buyer. The foregoing warranty shall not apply to any Work that is specified or otherwise demanded by Buyer and is not manufactured or selected by Seller, as to which (i) Seller hereby assigns to Buyer, to the extent assignable, any warranties made to Seller and (ii) Seller shall have no other liability to Buyer under warranty, tort or any other legal theory. The Seller warrants the Work, or any components thereof, through the earlier of (i) eighteen (18) months from delivery of the Work or (ii) twelve (12) months from initial operation of the Work or ninety (90) days from the performance of services (the "Warranty Period"). If Buyer gives Seller prompt written notice of breach of this warranty within the Warranty Period, Seller shall, at its sole option and as Buyer's sole and exclusive remedy, repair or replace the subject parts, re-perform the Service or refund the purchase price. Unless otherwise agreed to in writing by Seller, (i) Buyer shall be responsible for any labor required to gain access to the Work so that Seller can assess the available remedies and (ii) Buyer shall be responsible for all costs of installation of repaired or replaced Work. If Seller determines that any claimed breach is not, in fact, covered by this warranty, Buyer shall pay Seller its then customary charges for any repair or replacement made by Seller. Seller's warranty is conditioned on Buyer's (a) operating and maintaining the Work in accordance with Seller's instructions, (b) not making any unauthorized repairs or alterations, and (c) not being in default of any payment obligation to Seller. Seller's warranty does not cover (i) damage caused by chemical action or abrasive material, misuse or improper installation (unless installed by Seller) and (ii) media goods (such as, but not limited to, resin, membranes, or granular activated carbon media) once media goods are installed. THE WARRANTIES SET FORTH IN THIS SECTION 7 ARE THE SELLER'S SOLE AND EXCLUSIVE WARRANTIES AND ARE SUBJECT TO THE LIMITATION OF LIABILITY PROVISION BELOW. SELLER MAKES NO OTHER WARRANTIES OF ANY KIND, EXPRESS OR IMPLIED, INCLUDING WITHOUT LIMITATION, ANY WARRANTY OF MERCHANTABILITY OR FITNESS FOR PURPOSE.

8. Indemnity. Seller shall indemnify, defend and hold Buyer harmless from any claim, cause of action or liability incurred by Buyer as a result of third party claims for personal injury, death or damage to tangible property, to the extent caused by Seller's negligence. Seller shall have the sole authority to direct the defense of and settle any indemnified claim. Seller's indemnification is conditioned on Buyer (a) promptly, within the Warranty Period, notifying Seller of any claim, and (b) providing reasonable cooperation in the defense of any claim.

9. Assignment. Neither party may assign this Agreement, in whole or in part, nor any rights or obligations hereunder without the prior written consent of the other party; provided, however, the Seller may assign its rights and obligations under these terms to its affiliates or in connection with the sale or transfer of the Seller's business and Seller may grant a security interest in the Agreement and/or assign proceeds of the agreement without Buyer's consent.

10. Termination. Either party may terminate this agreement, upon issuance of a written notice of breach and a thirty (30) day cure period, for a material breach (including but not limited to, filing of bankruptcy, or failure to fulfill the material obligations of this agreement). For any order shipped outside of the United States, any dispute shall be referred to and finally determined by the International Center for Dispute Resolution in accordance with the provisions of its International Arbitration Rules, enforceable under the New York Convention (Convention on the Recognition and Enforcement of Foreign Arbitral Awards) and the governing language shall be English.

12. Export Compliance. Buyer acknowledges that Seller is required to comply with applicable export laws and regulations relating to the sale, exportation, transfer, assignment, disposal and usage of the Work provided under this Agreement, including any export license requirements. Buyer agrees that such Work shall not at any time directly or indirectly be used, exported, sold, transferred, assigned or otherwise disposed of in a manner which will result in non-compliance with such applicable export laws and regulations. It shall be a condition of the continuing performance by Seller of its obligations hereunder that compliance with such export laws and regulations be maintained at all times. NOTWITHSTANDING ANYTHING ELSE TO THE CONTRARY, SELLER SHALL NOT BE LIABLE FOR ANY CONSEQUENTIAL, INCIDENTAL, SPECIAL, PUNITIVE OR OTHER INDIRECT DAMAGES, AND SELLER'S TOTAL LIABILITY ARISING AT ANY TIME FROM THE SALE OR USE OF THE WORK, INCLUDING WITHOUT LIMITATION ANY LIABILITY FOR MECHANICAL WARRANTY CLAIMS OR FOR ANY BREACH OR FAILURE TO PERFORM ANY OBLIGATION UNDER THE CONTRACT, SHALL NOT EXCEED THE PURCHASE PRICE PAID FOR THE WORK. Buyer hereby agrees that it shall grant Seller access to the Leased Equipment location and shall permit Seller to take possession of and remove the Leased Equipment without resort to legal process and hereby releases Seller from any claim or right of action for trespass or damages caused by reason of such entry and removal.

15. Miscellaneous. These terms, together with any Contract Documents issued or signed by the Seller, comprise the complete and exclusive statement of the agreement between the parties (the "Agreement") and supersede any terms contained in Buyer's documents, unless separately signed by Seller. No part of the Agreement may be changed or cancelled except by a written document signed by Seller and Buyer. No course of dealing or performance, usage of trade or failure to enforce any term shall be used to modify the Agreement. To the extent the Agreement is considered a subcontract under Buyer's prime contract with an agency of the United States government, in case of Federal Acquisition Regulations (FARs) flow down terms, Seller will be in compliance with Section 44.403 of the FAR relating to commercial items and those additional clauses as specifically listed in 52.244-6, Subcontracts for Commercial Items (OCT 2014). If any of these terms is unenforceable, such term shall be limited only to the extent necessary to make it enforceable, and all other terms shall remain in full force and effect. The Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania without regard to its conflict of laws provisions. Both Buyer and Seller reject the applicability of the United Nations Convention on Contracts for the international sales of goods to the relationship between the parties and to all transactions arising from said relationship.

RE: Acquisition of Seventeen (17) APX6000 Police Radios

BACKGROUND/DISCUSSION:

The Police Department's current radio model, the Motorola XTS5000, was provided through a Cook County Department of Homeland Security Grant following national efforts to increase compatible communication systems post 9/11. The current radios were received in 2011. Cook County discontinued providing service to these radios in December of 2018 and Motorola is no longer manufacturing parts or servicing them. As use of the radios approaches the decade mark, the reliability of the current radios continues to be degraded. The cost of replacing the radios with the APX6000 model, which is the industry standard and Cook County's recommended unit, is approximately \$5,300 per unit, for a total replacement cost of approximately \$250,000. To accommodate such a large purchase, the police department spread the purchase of the radios over 4 fiscal budgets, the first funds being provided in fiscal year 2018/2019. The Police Department was provided the requested \$62,500 in fiscal year 2018/2019 (later assigned to the 2019/2020 budget) and \$30,000 in fiscal year 2019/2020. The Police Department is seeking to make the first of several radio purchases at this time to acquire seventeen (17) APX6000 radios through Cook County Emergency Telephone System Board (ETSB). While there is no difference in purchase price from purchasing the radios through Cook County ETSB over purchasing directly from Motorola, Cook County ETSB will program the radios at a discounted price and waive the annual fee for Starcom21, a statewide public safety-trunked radio system that will allow interoperability across the state.
